



News release - The Minister of Justice, HE Catalin Predoiu official guest speaker at the British Romanian Chamber of Commerce Business Breakfast event on 24th January 2012 and presented his vision of " how to create a good business environment; the implications of the new Civil Code for the business environment .

HE Minister Predoiu outlined the importance and effects of the new Civil Procedure Code for business and other aspects of the new legal framework that will come into force in Romania imminently. The Minister summarised updates that are designed to improve the material competence of the Courts and will simplify procedures and unify the law. The New Code will establish a series of new procedures; low value claims , filtering appeals, appeal for delay notification process and the High Court of Cassation and Justice for the absolution of legal issues.

The new Code will encourage mediation between parties. It introduces and amends some rules for communication summons and other procedural documents, re-thinking solutions that can give courts vested for review attack, or a new material solution promoted the appeal in the interest of law enforcement changes to procedures.

The Code is an opportunity to accelerate judgments, simplify procedures and reduce costs to litigants and government. It should however be accompanied by rational measures of allocation of human resources and appropriate and relevant training.

Mr. Raymond Breden, Executive Chairman of the British Romanian Chamber of Commerce chaired the event of some seventy participant members of the chamber and HE Martin Harris, the British Ambassador to Romania attended as a special guest of the chamber..
